

About Lassen County

Located in Northeastern California, Lassen County is the eighth largest county in the state geographically and the 47th in terms of population. The incorporated city of Susanville is the County seat, where a community of 10,000 is set in the scenic upper Honey Lake Valley, against a backdrop of forested mountains of the Northern Sierra Nevada and Southern Cascade ranges, and high desert to the east.

Lassen County affords unlimited outdoor recreation and sporting activities for residents and visitors. Attractions include: trophy trout fishing and water sports at nationally renowned Eagle Lake, the second largest natural lake in California; abundant hunting opportunities; the scenic Bizz Johnson Trail, a 25 mile long converted rail route between Susanville and historic Westwood which attracts mountain bikers, hikers, cross country skiers and fly fishing enthusiasts, and is the setting for the annual Boston qualifier Bizz Johnson Marathon.

The Susanville Ranch Regional County Park located adjacent to Susanville offers twenty-nine miles of single track. Nonmotorized multi-use trails wind through canyons, around meadows, and up into the hills in this uncrowded and unspoiled park. www.susanvilleranchpark.com

The Lassen County Arts Council sponsors music, drama and fine arts events throughout the year, and the annual Best of Broadway production features outstanding local talent. Susanville even supports its own symphony. Driving to regional destinations is surprisingly easy since traffic gridlock is not a local way of life. Extensive entertainment, shopping and an international airport in Reno are less than 90 minutes away. North Lake Tahoe ski resorts are within two hours. Driving time to Sacramento is usually under four hours and the Pacific Ocean at Eureka is about five hours away.

Residents of Lassen County enjoy a friendly rural mountain environment, outstanding family oriented recreation including many youth sports programs, and excellent schools. The cost of living and housing prices are lower in Lassen County than in most other regions of the state.



The Planning and Building Services Department

The Department is composed of a cohesive and stable 13 member team in four divisions: Planning, Building, Code Enforcement, Surveyor.

The Department's Vision states that: "We are a public service organization that puts customer service first; provides a dynamic growth-oriented work place; and contributes, through creative and motivated professionals, toward shaping Lassen County as a community of choice."

The Position

Under the direction of the Planning and Building Services Director, the Geographic Information System (GIS) Coordinator plans, coordinates, oversees and participates in the development, implementation, integration, operation, and maintenance of the County's geographic information system (GIS) and permit system.

Positions in this class perform the most complex professional geographic information system work and may direct lower level professional and technical staff, as assigned. Employees at this level are required to have full knowledge of the County GIS program and coordinate the development and maintenance of the County-wide GIS and associated databases, long range plans and/or specialized knowledge and training in unique issues particular to Lassen County. This includes management, development and update of the County Assessor Parcel Layer.

Examples of the duties of the position include:

- 1. Plan, direct, and participate in the acquisition, installation, administration, and operation of the County's geographic information system (GIS) and permit system; oversee software release installs and updates for both systems.
- 2. Serve as project lead for special GIS projects including planning, system integration, database development, implementation and application development; meet with various GIS users and Information Services management to plan and discuss system requirements; provide project status updates as needed.
- 3. Serve as system administrator for GIS ensuring that application software and hardware operates efficiently and meets the County's needs for information technology; update layers as changes occur.
- 4. Oversee the design and development of all databases associated with the GIS base map including relational databases; develop standards and strategies for maintaining database security.

- 5. Coordinate the design and development of userspecific GIS databases and permit types; configure system operational functions; prepare reports as necessary.
- 6. Represent County geographic information systems interests to various governmental agencies, professional organizations, and to the community as needed.

The approved job description in its entirety is available from the Lassen County Personnel Department.

Minimum Requirements

Education: Bachelor's degree or advanced degree with a major in geographic information systems, information technology, civil/structural engineering, architecture, or a closely related field is preferred (job related geographic information experience may be substituted on a year-for-year basis).

Experience: Four years of increasingly responsible geographic information systems experience.

License: Valid California driver's license is required.

The Ideal Candidate Will Demonstrate:

- Knowledge in the operations, services, and activities of a geographic information system program.
- Understanding of the uses, capabilities, and operational characteristics of geographic information systems equipment and specialized hardware including ArcInfo, ArcView, ArcMap, ArcGIS online, Google Earth and other computer mapping applications.
- Proficiency in the operation and maintenance of computer software and hardware, operating systems, local and wide area networks, internet and remote access computer systems.
- Understanding of database design and development.

Qualified applicants must submit an official Lassen County application to the Lassen County Personnel Department. Please provide specific, accurate and complete information that describes how you meet the minimum qualifications. Faxed copies are acceptable (530) 251-2663, but must be followed up with a signed original application.

The Selection Process

Application materials will be reviewed, and the best-qualified applicants will be invited to participate in interviews.
