DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Behavioral Health Case Worker Medication Technician provides medication support case management, mental health service delivery and crisis intervention. The major duties of the job include:

- Monitor service delivery to ensure an individual client's access to mental health service and the service delivery system.
- Monitor an individual's progress
- Assist in developing an overall plan for the client
- Coordinate client medication support and compliance consistent with scope of practice
- Coordinate service delivery (medication) with medical doctors, registered nurses, and therapeutic staff
- Coordinate and monitor medication prescriptions and refills with pharmacies
- Identify and pursue service resources intra and interagency consultation, communication, coordination and referral.
- May serve on an on-call basis for response to emergency crisis counseling calls.
- Prepare daily records and summarize progress of treatment for clients under direction of licensed or license-waivered staff.
- Assist in the public relations of the program, including educational and consultational presentations.
- Make home or agency visits.
- Learn to recognize mental health needs for the community and available community resources.
- May work with mental health staff conducting mental health education programs for the community.
- Perform related duties as assigned.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Education: **BHCW I:** Equivalent to an Associate's degree in a related field.
BHCW II: Equivalent to a Bachelor's degree in a related field.

Experience: **BHCW I:** Two years' experience providing rehabilitation and counseling services to individuals with emotional and mental problems. Experience coordinating client

medication support is preferred.

BHCW II: Four years' experience providing rehabilitation and counseling services to individuals with emotional and mental problems. Two years of the experience must have been in a mental health clinical setting equivalent to that gained as a Behavioral Health Case Worker (Medication Technician I).

License: **Must be a Licensed Vocational Nurse or a Licensed Psychiatric Technician authorized to practice in the State of California.**

Possession of or ability to obtain a valid California driver's license.

Knowledge of: Medications used for psychiatric care and treatment. Diagnosis of psychiatric disorders as contained within the most recent edition of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders. Medications interactions and side effects. Nursing assessment techniques.
