Section 65.5 of the California Agricultural Code requires the Agricultural Commissioner to compile a report covering conditions, acreage, production, and value of the agricultural products of his county.

This 4th annual crop report shows as before a gross return of agricultural commodities. The acreage and production remains about the same, although the per unit price in some cases is higher.

Lumber showed the greatest advancement in per unit price bringing more than two million dollars over last year, although considerably less board feet was produced.

As a matter of convenience we are showing the grand total amounts of the previous crop reports on the last page.
